




The Ann Arbor Region: A Place to Invest and Grow

The Ann Arbor region is home to the University of Michigan and hosts businesses ranging from high tech to culinary giants such as Domino's and Zingerman's.

The region is celebrated for its renowned cultural offerings including the Ann Arbor Art Fairs and the University Musical Society.

Top talent is drawn to the region of 562,000 residents. Ann Arbor ranked #1 in Livability's 2018 Best Place's to live list.



The region's affordability index, as compared with other high-tech destinations as well as a broad range of support services, drive business formation and growth.

Within the region, major sectors in auto, mobility, information technology, life science and healthcare continue to grow.

Companies are drawn to the high quality of life paired with infrastructure, talent and resources available from the University of Michigan and Eastern Michigan University.



The Ann Arbor Region Nurtures Innovation

With a rich automotive history and thriving engineering talent, Industry 4.0 is shaping the region. Advanced manufacturing, software development, big data, and other emerging technologies including augmented and virtual reality are driving new innovative businesses with products and services. One of the region's leading economic engines, Ann Arbor SPARK nurtures startups through it's Regional Incubator Network with innovation centers in downtown Ann Arbor and Ypsilanti. The centers assist companies in locating and securing capital, recruiting talent, and connecting emerging businesses with partners and prospective customers.

Groundspeed Analytics is a recent success story. Founded in 2016, Groundspeed uses artificial intelligence and data science systems to serve commercial property and casualty insurance carriers, brokers, and managing agents. Groundspeed continues to grow with more than 80 employees and has now attracted \$30M in Series B Funding.







Beyond the mainstage concerts and educational programs, listeners experience the A2SO through chamber concerts in Chelsea, Dexter, and Ypsilanti, and in special daytime chamber programs at the Jewish Community Center near Ann Arbor's Research Park – an Opportunity Zone.











About Opportunity Zones



Opportunity Zones Overview

Opportunity Zones provide federal tax relief for capital gains invested into certain low-income locations around the United States. Through the 2017 Tax Cuts and Jobs Act, the U.S. Congress Opportunity Zone program was created to stimulate investment in economically distressed communities as designated by selected United States census tracts.

States could designate up to 25 percent of low-income census tracts as Opportunity Zones. Here in Washtenaw and Livingston counties, we have Opportunity Zones located in Fowlerville, Ypsilanti, Ann Arbor, and Chelsea.

Since the Federal Opportunity Zone program was introduced, Opportunity Zone information, investment funds, and education about the program continue to be updated. To navigate through the complexity of the program, it is best to research program changes when exploring investment in opportunity zones. A list of resources is provided at the end of this document.

What tax incentives exist to invest in Opportunity Zones?

Opportunity Zone legislation provided tax incentives to reduce capital gains for investors that hold their money in a Qualified Opportunity Fund for at least five years with the greatest upside at 10 years or more. Investors must invest through a qualified Opportunity Fund to benefit from the tax incentives.

A tax-payer has 180 days to invest unrealized gains into a Qualified Opportunity Zone Fund (QOZ). A QOZ must invest 90% of the funds into a qualified Opportunity Zone

ARE THERE EXISTING OPPORTUNITY ZONE FUNDS?

Yes, several Opportunity Zone funds have been created. The National Council of State Housing Agencies (NCSHA), for example, has over 183 funds listed in the Opportunity Zone Fund Directory and is expected to raise \$44B in Opportunity Zone investment.

Three ways to get a tax incentive through investing in a qualified Opportunity Zone Fund*



Investors have up to 180 days to invest unrealized capital gains into a qualified Opportunity Zone Fund. Deferral is until the earlier of the date on which the investment is sold or exchanged or December 31, 2026.



Opportunity Zone Fund investments held for at least 5 years can receive a 10% reduction on the deferred gain. If held for at least 7 years, there is an additional exclusion of 5% thereby excluding up to 15% of the original capital gain from taxation.



An investment held for at least 10 years is exempt from capital gains taxes on the taxable income from the sale or exchange of an in investment in a qualified Opportunity Zone Fund. This only applies to gains that occurred after an investment in a QOF.

OZ Projects and Investment Types

WHAT PROJECTS CAN THEY SUPPORT?

The majority of qualified Opportunity Funds invest in some form of commercial real estate, including multifamily residential, student housing, mixed-use, hospitality, or other commercial development including community revitalization, affordable housing, and workforce housing.

Within Washtenaw and Livingston counties, Opportunity Zones are located in Fowlerville, Ypsilanti, Ann Arbor, and Chelsea.

WHAT TYPES OF INVESTMENTS ARE ALLOWED?

The investment options within opportunity zones are broad, which provides potential investors with a range of options. Broadly, Opportunity Zone Funds can be used for real estate or running a business (partnership interest or stock) with few limitations.

Opportunity Zone Funds are private sector investment vehicles that must invest at least 90 percent of their capital in qualifying assets located in Qualified Opportunity Zone.

WHERE ARE THE LOCAL OPPORTUNITY ZONES?

There are 11 federally approved Opportunity zones in Washtenaw (10) and Livingston (1) counties. Eight are in Ypsilanti, and one each in Ann Arbor, Chelsea, Pittsfield Township, and Fowlerville.

Ann Arbor, MI

- The Ann Arbor region is home to the University of Michigan and hosts a multitude of businesses ranging from startups to national headquarters, including Domino's. The vibrant downtown region has much to explore in the way of events, locally owned shops, and culinary delights such as Zingerman's Delicatessen.
- The region is known globally as a hub of high-tech companies. Top talent is drawn to the region, consisting of Washtenaw and Livingston counties, which has a population of 562,000. Ann Arbor continuously receives accolades, such as the #1 Best Place to Live, #1 Best College Town in America, and Top New Tech Hub. The region's affordability index as compared with other high-tech destinations, as well as a broad range of support services, drive business formation and growth.

Opportunity Zone Highlights

Ypsilanti, MI

- Ypsilanti fosters a progressive community with a vibrant arts scene and a rising downtown area. Ypsilanti, also known by locals as Ypsi, has a rich history which can be seen in the local architecture. There are two main business areas, Downtown and Depot Town, which are known for eclectic shops and local businesses, including the Ann Arbor SPARK East Innovation Center — a business accelerator for entrepreneurs.
- The city is home to Eastern Michigan University (EMU) which has been ranked for 17 consecutive years as one of the best colleges in the Midwest, according to The Princeton Review. EMU offers both undergraduate and graduate programs including a nationally accredited Cyber Defense program one of a handful in the country.
- The area boasts over 23,000+ acres of public park and recreation areas including opportunities for canoeing, kayaking, and fishing on the beautiful Huron River.





Opportunity Zone Highlights

Chelsea, MI

- Chelsea, Michigan is a charming community with a balance of downtown, residential, and rural geographies. Residents enjoy quality living, a variety of work options, and many recreational opportunities including biking trails and kayaking. On the edge of downtown is the home of "JIFFY" Mix — the Chelsea Milling Company.
- Located in western Washtenaw County, Chelsea is the hub for a larger regional community. The rural character and natural beauty of the surrounding area help give the city its character. Chelsea is located along I-94, within a one-hour drive from Ann Arbor, Jackson, Detroit, and Lansing.
- Chelsea is rich in diverse cultural and recreational opportunities. The city's vibrant parks and public spaces, historic downtown and active historical society, and public art build a strong sense of identity. Chelsea is also home to the Purple Rose Theatre, founded by actor Jeff Daniels and a venue for professional theater. Recreation opportunities include the city's three community parks, the Arctic Coliseum Ice Arena, and Pierce Lake Golf Course.

Fowlerville, MI

- Fowlerville is a village in Livingston County in the U.S. state of Michigan. It is located in the northeast portion of Handy Township and is independent from the township.
- Livingston county is home to to a strong industrial and advanced manufacturing base including Asahi Kasei plastics, Total Security Solutions (Inc. 5000 winner), and is home to Aisin Holdings of America automotive components test track and proving ground in Handy Township.
- Livingston has ample recreational opportunities to explore and enjoy the outdoors with access to over 123 miles of trails and 184 lakes. Livingston county also is home to communities with vibrant downtowns in the communities of Brighton and Howell amongst others.
- KW Corporation is a nation-wide technology implementation contractor specializing in network hardware infrastructure and security solutions and was recently awarded a FastTrack award for rapid growth for three consecutive years.




